### Forum on aging

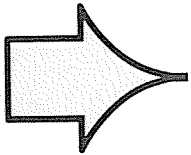

### City plans discussion on County Road 10

Mounds View officials have invited developers, real estate brokers and staff from other cities to a roundtable discussion of redevelopment along County Road 10, the center of the city's business community. The discussion is scheduled for April 7 at a City Council work session at City Hall.

There are 10 contiguous properties for sale running southeast along County Road 10, totaling 12.3 acres. The city owns one of the properties, the site of a former gas station at County Roads 10 and H2. The discussion also will cover the future of the Saturn car dealership, also for sale, in the same area.

Because the city owns only one of the properties, its role is limited "just to promoting it to the development community," said economic development specialist Heidi Steinmetz. "We're trying to gain insight from the development community, both those who are familiar with the area and those who aren't."
